

## DWP Unlikely to Benefit/Excluded

Some people may not have to participate in employment services because they are deemed unlikely to benefit or they are excluded.

Let your counselor know if you fit into one of these categories.

<b>Unlikely to Benefit</b>
You are unable to obtain/retain employment due to an illness, injury, or incapacity that is expected to last at least 60 days.
You need to take care of a family member living in your household who is ill, injured or incapacitated for at least 60 days.
You are needed in the home to care for a child who meets special medical needs criteria.
You are pregnant and unable to obtain/retain employment due to the pregnancy.

<b>Exclusions</b>
You have a child only case.
You are a single parent with a child under 12 weeks old. (This can only be used once in parent's lifetime.)
You are a minor parent without a High School Diploma or equivalent.
You are 18 or 19 years old without a High School Diploma or equivalent and chooses the education option.
You are a caregiver 60 years of age or older.
One or more parents in the household have received 60 months of TANF assistance.
One or more parents in the household have been convicted of fraud under MFIP or DWP.
Both parents in the household have received MFIP within the past 12 months.
Both parents in the household have received DWP in the past 12 months.
