

Self-Administered Alcohol and Drug Screening Test

If you ask, we will give you this information in another form, such as Braille, large print or audio tape.

These questions will help you find out if you have a problem with alcohol or drug use. You can choose to answer them. You do not have to share the answers with your county human service agency.

1. Have you ever felt you should cut down on your drinking or drug use? Yes No
2. Have people annoyed you by criticizing your drinking or drug use? Yes No
3. Have you ever felt bad or guilty about your drinking or drug use? Yes No
4. Have you ever had a drink or used drugs first thing in the morning (an eye-opener) to get rid of a hangover? Yes No

If you answered yes to 2 or more of the questions above you may have a problem with either alcohol or drugs. Your county can help you find out if you need help with alcohol or drug problems. If it is decided you need help, the cost of treatment will be covered. The county can help you make arrangements to care for your children.

Warning for Pregnant Women

Fetal alcohol syndrome is a birth defect that can occur when a pregnant woman drinks alcohol.
