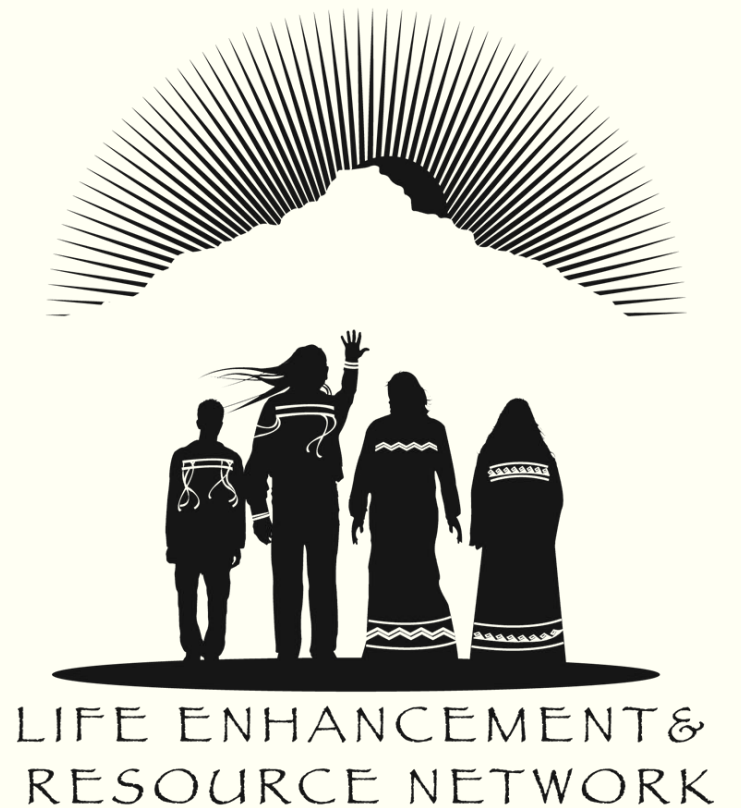

Salt River Tribal TANF Overview

- Established in 1999
- Recently raised income eligibility to 250% of the Federal Poverty Guideline
- Per-Capita income not countable income
- Land lease income not countable income
- 62 Total TANF Cases
 - 21 Child Only
 - 8 Two Parent
 - 33 Single Parent
- Located in urban Phoenix metropolitan area
