2 Titles - 1 Mission



Vocational Education

- Educational training that provides practical experience in a particular occupational field.
- The goal is to train workers to be masters of their trade.
- Longer term outlook

Workforce Development

- prepares workers with needed skills, emphasizes the value of workplace learning and addresses the hiring demands of employers from the outset
- The goal is to place workers in jobs where there are career development opportunities.
- Short or immediate need trainings





Barriers to Our Mission


- Long term trainings
 - Remove people from the active labor pool
 - Remove people from their community and family responsibilities
 - Fail to respect the seasonal timing of subsistence activities
- Geography
 - Not every job or training can happen in every village
- Industry Demanded Standards





Our Geographic Barriers

- 94,796 square miles
- Larger than the State of Utah (84,896 sq mi)
- 8 (+1) communities
- 1 community connected seasonally by ice roads
- 7,385 residents in the Borough (does not include non-resident workers)
- 5 (+1) communities
 connected to fiber
 communication lines; 3
 use satellite relay







Achieving that Mission

- long term trainings
 - Everything is a 1-2 week module (or full length)
 - Flexible scheduling
- Geography
 - Travel assistance from our villages
 - Instructors go to EVERY village each year
 - Distance delivery is growing
- Increasing standards based instruction
 - Local Class B AND Class A CDL options in Utqiagvik





Educational Support

- Short Term Workforce Trainings
 - Industry credentials
 - Tailored to your needs and requests
 - All classes are registered CEU credits
 - Each class is transcripted and can be easily tracked
 - Flexible scheduling
 - Village delivery all fees waived





Educational Support

- **Longer Term Career Trainings**
 - Vocational trades are based on NCCER curriculum
 - Credits are cross-listed with NCCER Modules
 - Flexible modular scheduling
- Apprentice Sponsorship
 - Carpenter
 - Electrician
 - Plumber
 - Construction Laborer
 - Weatherization Tech (Building Energy Retrofit Tech)
 - *Building Maintenance Technician
 - **Heavy Equipment Operator





Making Connections

- Arctic Slope Regional Corporation Paananaq
 Project
- Arctic Education Foundation
 - \$4,500 per calendar year for short term training
- Each native corporation has shareholder support services
- Inupiat Community of the Arctic Slope –
 Vocational Rehabilitation
- North Slope Borough departments and resources





Industry Advisement & Coordination



- Communicate & Advise
 - Quarterly roundtable advisement panels
 - Training needs, locations, instructors, etc.
 - Mailing and marketing campaigns
- Student connections
 - Apprenticeships, internships, job openings
 - Public support resources
- Training opportunities
 - The workplace becomes a classroom
 - Courses can be tailored to a specific employer/position

Rooted in our Iñupiat Values

- Alaska's only Tribal College
- Our communities rely on subsistence activities



- Fall whaling, caribou/moose hunting, winter preparations
- Winter/Spring celebrations, whaling, trapping, ice roads open
- Our schedule must be culturally sensitive.





Flexible & Supportive

- Industry demands come as the projects or needs arise.
 - If we are not flexible in meeting demands, that's when we lose the opportunity to connect our local people to the jobs.
 - Subcontracting becomes the alternative solution.
- Students are not accustomed to preregistering for classes.




