

- ✓ EMPLOYMENT OUTCOMES: The number of cases closing due to employment each month has more than *doubled* since January 2017. On average, participants are moving to employment within 9 weeks of entering the program
- ✓ WORK REQUIREMENTS: The number of TANF recipients meeting
 the required work hours has quadrupled

Maine: New TANF Spending – Investing in our Parents and Children – Family Futures Downeast (Two-Gen Strategy)

Helping Parents and Children

Living in poverty can be passed on from one generation to the next. To stop the cycle, Family Futures Downeast believes that children should be empowered at the same time as their parents. How does this "empowerment" happen?

Quality Education at No Direct Cost

Families that become a part of Family Futures Downeast are given the opportunity to participate in a positive, supportive learning environment. Over the course of a year, parents will be enrolled part-time in specially-designed college classes held in the evenings while their children are provided with age-appropriate instruction, all at no out-of-pocket cost.



Maine: New TANF Spending – Investing in our Parents and Children – Higher Opportunity Pathways for Employment (HOPE)



- ✓ Unanimous bipartisan legislation.
- ✓ Provides post-secondary education (emphasis on community college two-year degrees), certificate training, support services, and child care to non-cash-TANF families with household income at or below 185% FPL.
- ✓ Establishes college navigator positions to provide support and barrier remediation for families in the HOPE program.
- ✓ Primarily funded with TANF block grant, CCDBG, and some SNAP E&T funds. Services funded with TANF are all non-assistance in nature. No general fund dollars are used for this program.
