

TANF/Child Welfare Coordination Grant Goals

- **Chippewa Cree Tribal TANF/Child Welfare Coordination Grant goals:**
 - A. Intensive case management services to facilitate family strengthening and improve TANF compliance by achieving goals on clients TANF Individual Improvement Plan.**
 - B. Preserve families**
 - C. Provide “Wrap-Around” services with family and program providers.**

Positive Parenting

- **Chippewa Cree Positive Parenting is structured after the model developed by the National Indian Child Welfare Association (NICWA).**
- **This curriculum was developed for two goals:**
 - **A. To help Chippewa Cree parents in their search for values and attitudes inherent in traditional Indian child rearing practices.**
 - **B. The parents may then be enabled to develop positive and productive attitudes, values, and parenting skills which have their roots in their own cultural heritage.**

Family Strengthening

- **The Strengthening Families Program is a 14-session, evidence based curriculum for parents and children designed for high-risk families.**
- **Chippewa Cree Tribal Court collaborates with TANF, Child Welfare, and Social Services where parents and children participate both separately and together for each session.**
- **A meal is shared by the families that includes informal family practice time and group leader coaching.**

Traditional Peacemakers

- **Chippewa Cree Tribal Peacemakers/Advocates:**
 - **A) Client intervention and mediation**
 - **B) Peacemakers counsel enter into a Traditional Circle and talk to parents about the meaning of the child as believed in the Chippewa Cree customs and values. The Traditional Circle is a powerful setting with the most heartfelt use of words for the family and how the family can help themselves and their children. The Traditional Circle outcome can be drawn up in a formal agreement with the parents, grandparents, and can be filed in Tribal Court.**


TANF Child Welfare Case Management Internal Performance Audit
