WHY GLOBAL TALENT IDAHO STARTED

3M	open jobs in the U.S. due to lack of qualified workers
1,000	refugees resettled in Idaho each year
~20%	of refugees resettled in Idaho each year are college educated with professional experience
\$18K	average annual income in 2014 for newly resettled refugees (40 hrs./week @ \$8.55/hr.)

Without help navigating the challenges of the U.S. professional employment landscape, high skilled workers experience and brain power are wasted despite demand!

THE VALUE PROPOSITION

Employers

Need skilled, diverse professionals to compete in the global marketplace

Are experiencing skills shortages in high-demand fields

Are unaware of how to access this talent pool

Immigrants

Are pre-screened, workauthorized, highly skilled professionals who are under-employed

Demonstrate an interest and motivation to gain U.S. work experience and build their professional networks

Equips job seekers with soft skills training to help them overcome barriers

Provides employers with high-quality talent that matches the skillset and qualifications desired

GLOBAL TALENT IDAHO OUTCOMES



Quality of life improves, additional tax revenue is generated, consumer spend goes up, and white collar diversity increases when skilled immigrants and refugees get professional-level jobs!

WHAT ABOUT REGULATED PROFESSIONS?

Resettlement Agency Resettlement Process (typically 8 months)

- First job (for highly skilled, usually a survival job)
- Healthcare
- Self-sufficiency
