• Family Tree's Mission: To help people overcome child abuse, domestic violence and homelessness to become safe, strong and self-reliant.

Family Tree Service Areas

Housing and Family Stabilization

- Homelessness Programs
- Kinship Programs
- Military and Veteran Programs
- Domestic Violence Services
- Children and Youth Services

Family Tree has been providing kinship contract services since 1999.

- Adams County TANF Stable Families
 Program serving Child Only TANF for 15
 years 1,930 families total, of which 1,326
 are kinship families.
- Arapahoe County Kinship Programs served 659 kinship families through TANF and Child Welfare over a 7 year period.
- Douglas County Kinship Navigator Program has served 114 kinship families.

Kinship Services

- Initial Home Visit to assess the family's needs and current situation
- Case Management time varies by county
- Resources and Referrals
- Financial Assistance based on needs
- Support and Acknowledgement
- Linkages to services and/or benefits
- Legal Assistance

Financial Assistance through TANF funds

- Each county sets their own limit per family
- Average spent per family is about \$1600
- Items most needed
 - Rent, mortgage and utilities
 - Clothing for children
 - Transportation
 - Extracurricular activities, school fees, camp
 - Beds and bedding
 - Custody fees



Additional Family Tree Services

- Monthly Free Kinship Legal Clinic
 - Paralegals to help with court forms
 - Lawyers to provide legal education and guidance
- Annual Relatives Raising Children Conference in collaboration with other community providers
- Vouchers for our thrift store

Benefits of contracting out

- Collaboration with a community partner who has specialized knowledge – use experts
- Gives clients access to other geographical locations
- Clients feel more relaxed and welcome contact from the community
- Families are more likely to tell us what they really need fear is significantly reduced
- Another set of eyes on the family
- We tell clients this is a service provided by their County that they choose to do – "Your County wants you to succeed!" We get to brag about you.



Cost of raising a child to 18 years of age

Approximately a quarter of a million dollars or \$13,611 per year for 18 years*
Foster care approximately \$6,074 per year
TANF approximately \$1,536 per year

Childcare - one of the Biggest Needs

- The average annual cost for two children (an infant and a 4 year old) in a child care center ranged from \$9,175 in Mississippi to \$28,606 in Massachusetts.*
- What if childcare could be paid to relatives instead of putting children in foster care?
 - Need is for a shorter time period
 - Up to age 5 and then afterschool until age 12


