Oklahoma TANF & Child Care Programs

- Both programs are state administered by the Oklahoma Department of Human Services
- TANF/child care go hand in hand in Oklahoma (our child care & TANF policies can be found online at <u>www.okdhs.org</u>)
- Assigned TANF worker maintains the TANF, SNAP, Medicaid, and child care on one comprehensive case
- One worker per family not multiple workers for each program



Requirements for TANF Child Care:

- Mandatory cooperation with child support
- Must be participating in a countable TANF work component and/or employment



Benefits of Child Care for TANF Recipients:

- Allows TANF households to move into the workforce with affordable licensed child care
- TANF household predetermined for \$0 family share care co-payment
- Allows for TANF population to receive education and job training without having to worry about quality care for their children
- Oklahoma currently does not have a waiting list for child care



Benefits of Child Care for TANF Recipients

- Fewer children left at home alone
- Provides licensed care with appropriate caregiver
- Decreases potential for child welfare referrals when children are left in a safe place
- Promotes family stability and self-sufficiency by allowing more families to move into the workforce



Transitional Benefits to Employment

Earned Income Disregard (EID)

Earnings exempt for the first 3 months of employment

Subsidized Employment Program (SEP)

Earnings exempt for the first 4 months of employment



Transitional TANF Benefit

EID and SEP benefits include:

- \$0 family share co-pay for child care
- Provides support to families transitioning from family assistance into the workforce
- SNAP benefits frozen at the TANF rate during this timeframe
