

























Transcript - Slide 12 Video

Jermaine Leef: Kia ora, I'm Jermaine.

Eru Bennett-Paul: Kia ora, I'm Eru.

Marino Taiatini: Kia ora, Marino.

All: And we're the JGeeks. J, J, J, J — [laughing]

Title: JGeeks Wai Korero with Fender

On screen: JGeeks and Fender hanging out, showing dance moves to people. Cut to office space.

Jermaine Leef: —Waipareira are represented, and what they do for our culture and our people, and so do JGeeks, and that's what we do for our people.

On screen: Interview set, footage of group doing dance and spear moves.

Jermaine Leef: We share the same the visions, we share the same values, which is all about Māori, and the world that we live in today, the environment that we live in today. We want different—sort of think like we work on the entertainment side of things. Waipareira looks more at infrastructure, [Māori word] and things like that.... So it's all about [unintelligible] and linking them in together so that we can express that and share that with more people and bring our brand with them, and they can bring their brand with us, and we can like move it together.

On screen: TV show.

Group member: JGeeks—innovate: culture, lifestyle, dance, film and television.

On screen: Interview set.

Jermaine Leef: We're Māoris. We all come from different backgrounds, [unintelligible] styles, sporting, growing up in a modern-day world—

On screen: TV show.

Group member: We're drawing on the *kaumātua* [elders]. You're drawing on Māori history and we're bringing it forward.

On screen: Group in office space.

Jermaine Leef: Here's JGeeks, and here's the Waipareira Trust. And then one starts to merge and evolve, and listens to the current style of technology and entertainment. And you've got Waipareira Trust over here, and [unintelligible] ... very aware of the old tradition and old-school Māori styles, but it's also aware of the new styles, and the new way we do things. And we put it together [all put hands together], and it's a high five!

Split screen: Office space, practicing dance moves with spears.

Jermaine Leef: It's about Māori. It's about taking old-school traditions and bringing them in a modern-day—you know, just like some of the things, they might not work in today's world, so we've gotta evolve with it and move with the culture, move with the times. So that's who we are. I think the link works perfectly. I think it's anywhere our values are shared [unintelligible] because we're doing it in our different streams. So if we can do that with [unintelligible] avenue streams, from business to entertainment to [speaking Māori] to all of these streams, the more we can pull them together, the better the machine moves.

On screen: TV shows.

Group member: We offer like a vessel of showing people Māori culture in a brand new, crazy way.

Group member: And we're not taking the antiquated form anymore.

On screen: Interview set.

Jermaine Leef: No, we've taken those old ways of the kaumātua and old Māori traditions and we try and fuse them with the modern stuff and look to the future as well, so we're just sitting in the middle of it.

On screen: TV show, stage performances.

Group member: —and innovating on what I feel is my culture, as music, entertainment, dance. We want to represent Māori on an international scale. We want to take all of that history, bring it all forward, put it in a mainstream context—

On screen: Group in office space.

Title: JGeeks x Waipareira, The Collab!

Jermaine Leef: —some dance moves. Here's what we're gonna do—

All: [jumping, shaking legs] Dee, dee, dee, dee, dee, dee, dee—right—foom, foom, foom, foom—foom. [laughing]

Jermaine Leef: So we put it all together and put some music to it ...

[Benny Hill theme]

On screen: Dancing to Benny Hill. Cut to interview set.

Jermaine Leef: The philosophy of it is sharing our beautiful culture with the people, and we're doing it our style.

Male singer: Māori style!

[Electro-funk music]

On Screen: montage of JGeeks performances.

[Opening music]

On screen: Opening montage of New Zealand, people, and company logo.
