Barriers such as unemployment, rent increases, mental health issues, substance use, and many others that contribute to housing instability have risen, creating a spike in housing challenges for TANF participants. While efforts have increased from many federal, state, and local agencies to try and mitigate the impact of homelessness on communities, there is still more work to be done. This session will start by addressing the contributing factors to rising rates of homelessness and what housing assistance resources are available to TANF participants, and close with best practices that have been implemented in communities that have shown positive results in addressing the homelessness crisis. Although identifying the disparities is a strong initial step, the impact of change continues with creating an action plan to address changes needed, implementing those actionable next steps, and then evaluating the outcomes. This session will discuss what racial and ethnic disparities are present in TANF service delivery and what changes can be made/are taking place to address these problems. Participants will actively participate in an open discussion to share the biggest obstacles they are facing and what impactful changes are taking place in their TANF agencies to address racial and ethnic disparities in service delivery.
