

Strengthening TANF Programs

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Changing Demands

- Decrease in federal funding to support TANF programs
 - Declining value and reallocation of the TANF block grant
 - Discontinuation of federal supplemental grants
 - End of American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA) funds
- Increase in the demand for public assistance programs
- High unemployment, fewer full-time jobs

Responses by States and Localities

- Explicit efforts to reduce program costs
 - Reductions in state and local administrative and program staffing
 - Reduction in the amount of the cash grant
 - Decreased availability of work and personal supports
- Limit TANF caseload growth
- Modified contracts with local employment service providers
- Rethinking TANF practices and performance measures

Opportunities

- Redefining the vision and mission of the state or local TANF program
- Making cost-neutral policy and program changes
- Increasing program engagement
- Improving business processes
- Using data to increase program awareness and performance
