




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LEP Pathway contracts are comprised of 5 different funding sources - Social Services, Targeted Assistance, State, TANF, and WEX/CS. LEP contracts may contain Employment Services, ESL, Skills Training, and WEX/CS WEX/CS funding is TANF State, and is earmarked for strictly WEX/CS services. RRA, Mental Health, and Volunteer Training all have a single funding source - Social Services. Federal Carry Forward will normally be Social Services Grant funding.


