





Two Generation Approach



Two Generation is...

- Our intentional approach to reducing poverty seeks to **strengthen families** by giving low-income parents and children the opportunity to **succeed together**, in tandem.
- This approach connects parents with tools like hands-on job training and education that will
 enable them to get a stable job and increase economic opportunity for themselves and their
 families.
- Parents enhance their professional and parenting skills so they create a more nurturing home
 environment, while their children receive high-quality early education to help them reach their
 fullest potential in the classroom and beyond.

Two Generation Hypothesis

we can help programs **simultaneously** combine targeted family economic supports and interventions to parents, skill building for parents in their role as parents, and high-quality early education and early school supports for their children,

THEN the outcomes for both parents and children will be significantly better than if only one of these interventions were delivered.

Total-Family Outcomes

PARENT/CAREGIVER OUTCOMES

- · Less parental stress
- Stronger parenting skills to better support children
- Parents develop confidence as their child's first teacher and best advocate
- Parents recognized as leaders and experts on caring for their kids




FAMILY ECONOMIC OUTCOMES

- Better able to meet basic needs such as food, housing, transportation
- Greater income = financial stability, ability to achieve major economic outcomes (i.e., buying a car, getting out of debt)
- Housing stability

CHILD OUTCOMES

- More positive, highquality interactions with parents and caregivers
- Improved socialemotional development
- Ready for school
- Continue to meet school and life milestones

What Is Coaching

Our Definition

The practice of partnering with clients so that overtime they acquire the skills, resources, and behavior changes necessary to attain and preserve economic independence.

- Process of identifying what is important, and aligning thoughts, words, and actions.
- ☐ Honors the <u>family as expert</u> in his/ her life and believes the family is creative, resourceful and whole.
- Designed to assist the family to identify goals and priorities.
- Action-oriented.
- Future and forward focused.

Coaching is NOT

- ☐ Therapy usually deals with the past.
- ☐ Case management "This is what you need to do."
- ☐ Predictable or cookie cutter. There is no template.
- Directive.






