Intersections of TANF and Child Welfare

TANF

 Provide assistance to needy families so that children may be cared for in their own homes or in the homes of relatives.

Child Welfare

- Children are safely maintained in their own homes whenever possible and appropriate
- The continuity of family relationships and connections is preserved for children
- Families have enhanced capacity to provide for their children's needs
