Determining Compensation

When a community member is invited to participate in a capacity where other participants are being paid by the organizations they represent, or another source, the host organization or program should compensate the community member on an hourly or flat rate basis.

Sharing power with families

Communicate and connect in multiple ways is a way to build trust:

- Meet one-on-one with members to build relationships. Learn about who members are as individuals and their unique story.
- Send a weekly text to check-in.
- Communicate regularly via emails or newsletters.
- Use opportunities to connect at meetings and share celebrations and challenges among members.

The meetings are co-facilitated by a member. The facilitator and staff member meet with presenters prior to the meeting to prepare them and ensure they are coming to the meeting for true guidance from the group. Presenters are asked to come with the intent to make change.
