





Barriers to Employment

- Lack of education
- Lack of transportation & driver's license
- Minimal daycare providers
- Huge shortage of housing
- Economic growth is minimal limiting employment for the community
- Support system is limited

Steps to eliminating barriers...

- Assistance Community Options Inc., Career Options provides to help eliminate barriers
 - Daily/weekly contact
 - Professional job coaching/mentoring
 - Vocational Skills workshops
 - Job marketing within the community
 - Work with local businesses
 - Assist with setting up transportation
 - One on one intervention/intense case management
 - Assist in getting support when needed

Daycare Project

- <u>Daycare project</u>: Case Manager has created a task force team that have been meeting monthly.
 - Goal: is to get at least one daycare location if not more to participate with Career Options in holding spots for last minute daycare needs while participants search for permanent daycare and/or employment.

Small Business Development

- Small businesses: Case Manager has researched and attended meetings with the Small Business Administration of North Dakota to gather information on how to create your own small business.
 - Case Manager will hold vocational workshops to provide the information needed to start ones own business.
 - Case Manager will assist with small business mentoring

Support Groups

- Case Manager will assist in developing support groups to meet needs of the participants
 - Utilizing the locations within the community the Case Manager has set up, small support groups will assist those who may need support.
 - Participants will be professionally coached to teach the leadership skills needed to organize the groups themselves with the support of Career Options.
 - Support groups are a need for many of those participants even if they may have support but seeking more to give themselves more strength.

Parish & Children's Camp Project

➤ Clean up project(s):

Community Options Inc., - Career Options created clean up days to assist in the clean up in the community of the Standing Rock Indian Reservation.

- •Local Parish/camp clean up: Case Manager is working with two of the local pastors to assist in getting participants involved with the clean up of the parishes and local camps for the children of their community.
- ■Teams will be developed by participants so that those involved can maintain their hours for the JOBS program while giving back to their community.

Graveyard Cleanup Project

- ➤ <u>Graveyards</u>: Participants have created teams of individuals with guidance from Community Options Inc., Career Options staff that are involved with the clean up of their own community including sites such as the graveyards that have needed some much deserved cleanup & care.
- Participants are going to continue with the Cleanup project within their community by developing teams of individuals and submitting ideas weekly to their case manager within the community that may be a need for some cleanup.
