## Meeting Goals and Participants

The Administration for Children and Families (ACF) San Francisco Regional office held a Tribal TANF Technical Assistance Meeting in Scottsdale, AZ, September 1-2, 2010.

There were several goals for the meeting:

- Facilitate dialogue among Tribal TANF grantees, Arizona State representatives, and Federal staff working with the TANF Program in Region IX;
- Share data management strategies for tracking, managing and reporting Work Participation Rate Data;
- Support State-Tribe coordination on data reporting and eligibility;
- Foster networking among Tribal TANF grantees; and,
- Provide specific training requested by the Tribes to strengthen Tribal TANF programs. The two areas identified were:
  - Leadership and Management of Tribal TANF Programs, and
  - Culturally Competent Case Management.

Thirty-one individuals participated in the meeting. They represented:

- ACF Region IX, San Francisco Office Staff;
- ACF Office of Family Assistance;
- Region IX Tribal TANF grantees in Arizona;
- Arizona Department of Economic Security Tribal liaisons and key representatives; and
- Two presenters.

## **Opening Session**

Rick Wever, Senior Program Specialist, ACF Region IX opened the meeting on the first day with greetings and introduced the Tribal Elder who led the opening blessing. Mr. Wever then went over the meeting agenda and introduced the OFA Regional and Central Office Staff.

## Dialogue between ACF Staff and Tribal TANF Grantees

The dialogue session was led by Ray Apodaca, OFA Tribal Services Program Specialist. He responded to discussion items identified by the Tribal TANF grantees including the latest status on ACF's Tribal consultation policy, the key principles for use of Tribal TANF funds, and the difference between Federal vs. State MOE TANF funds. Participants were actively engaged in asking questions to enhance their program and seeking clarification on ACF policies to better understand program parameters as well as opportunities for policy change.

# Data Reporting and Eligibility Led by Arizona Department of Economic Security

Judith Fritsch, the Native American Liaison for the Division of Aging and Adult Services, initiated this session. The State conducts data collection and reporting under agreements with three out of the six Tribes, which makes partnership and communication essential to the success of the programs. The State led a discussion of potential areas for improvement in Tribal-State communication, including increased training for State personnel (the eligibility offices serve both State and Tribal TANF clients) and the need for Tribes to submit any amendments to their TANF plans to the State far in advance of a change so that the State can prepare the data system to reflect the desired change. Mitchell Li, who manages Tribal TANF data and submits it to ACF, agreed to send out quarterly data reports to the Tribes to provide them with feedback and potential errors that need to be corrected.

## Data Reporting Session Led by ACF

Ray Apodaca facilitated this session by describing the current process for calculating work participation rates (WPR). Tribal participants voiced their frustrations with the current system, such as the lack of timely feedback on data that has been submitted (especially the WPR data) and questions about the type of data requested (the "other" category). Mr. Apodaca acknowledged the Tribes' frustrations and discussed how OFA is working to improve data management. Lastly, he presented the data system options that are currently being used by Tribal TANF programs: the private TAZ system, the State system, or a couple Tribal-designed data systems.

## Leadership and Management of Tribal TANF Programs

Clint Hackney, the Program Manager for the South Puget Intertribal Planning Agency (SPIPA) Tribal TANF Program, led this session by first asking the Tribes to identify some of the obstacles they face and what they wanted to learn from the session. Tribal participants wanted to learn how to promote teamwork, motivate staff, improve customer services, and incorporate Tribal culture into their organizational culture. Mr. Hackney instructed that to attain any of their leadership or management objectives, the Tribes must first identify their goals for their Tribal TANF programs; these goals included community development, self-sufficiency, and changing lives. He led a discussion on some of the critical characteristics of leadership, eight "Qualities of Team Excellence," and six "Application of Influence."

### Culturally Competent Case Management

Dr. Geni Cowan, from the U.C. Davis Center for Human Services, presented this session on how to utilize culturally-based strengths to create effective case plans for Tribal TANF participants. Her discussion focused on how a Tribe's case management system can reflect and correspond with Tribal and cultural values. This interactive session asked participants to identify what a culturally competent Tribal TANF program would look like and how a TANF participant would know that a program was culturally competent. In addition, the Tribes requested some specifics on case record documentation, including the fundamental elements retained in a case file.

## Closing

Rick Wever closed the meeting by thanking the presenters and participants for their time and participation. The closing prayer was given. Evaluations were collected and all OFA staff remained for individual questions from participants.
