

## TANF Time Limits and Racial Disproportionality in Washington State

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### Time Limits Overview

- Federal law limits TANF receipt as an adult to 60 months
  - States may offer hardship extensions to some recipients (< 20% of the caseload)</li>
- Budget cuts led to changes in state TANF program during the Great Recession
  - More restrictive definition of hardship
  - 60-month limit applied to ineligible parents of child TANF recipients

### Profiles of Time-Limited Clients

- Compare clients on cases terminated due to the adult recipient time limit to
  - Clients on cases terminated for other reasons
  - All clients
- Characteristics examined include
  - Demographics
  - Medical history (physical and behavioral health)
  - Housing status (unstably housed)
  - Arrest/conviction history
  - Substance use
  - Child welfare involvement
  - Employment history



## Comparison of Time-Limited TANF Recipients with Other TANF Clients, Race and Ethnicity, SFY 2018





### TLE Analysis: Applying an Equity Analysis Tool

#### Multidimensional Equity Analysis Tool (MDEA)

- Applied to TLE policy, procedure, and process.
- Application included analysis of TLE policy documents, staff training, interviews with staff, and observation of interactions with customers.

#### Characteristics of tool

- Cornerstones include looking at equity across a variety of dimensions but focuses on institutional structures such as policy and procedure.
- Is intersectional, with a focus on groups that are disproportionally affected by poverty and understanding of racism as a root cause of poverty.
- Includes an analytical framework informed by community-based action research methods and continuous improvement methods.



### Multi-Dimensional Equity Analysis (MDEA) Tool

- > Equity and Diversity taking a front seat at CSD
- > Coaching and providing support with participant interaction
- > Evaluating policies past, current, and future
- > Breaking down barriers and supporting families of color

### Legislative Report

- Annually report disaggregated data on race and ethnicity for TANF clients who experienced benefit reductions or terminations due to time limits and sanctions to the Legislature
  - If racial disproportionality exists, ESA must describe what it is doing to ameliorate it
- First year of implementation covered SFY 2020 (July 2019 June 2020)



## Race and Ethnicity for Clients on TANF Cases Terminated or Denied Due to Time Limits, July 2019 – March 2020



### Homeless Time Limit Extension

- Legislature added new time limit extension category for homeless clients, effective July 2019
  - Legislation passed in 2021 adds an additional category that uses McKinney-Vento definition
- Used risk ratios to examine disproportionality
  - Race/ethnicity, gender, primary language, age, citizenship status, marital status, educational attainment

## Eliminating Disparities with TANF Time Limit Policies and Procedures During COVID-19


A new time limit extension was created for those families at or exceeding the 60-month time limit

Emergency rule filing to allow staff to apply this new TLE

A workaround was implemented to extend all families on a TLE over 60 months, if they did not meet another hardship.

Correction of cases closed in error
