What is the Nnee Bich'o Nii (TANF) Program?

The Nnee Bich'o Nii "Helping the People"
Program is designed to help participants
living on the San Carlos Apache Reservation
to develop strong families through education,
support services, employment skills training
and cash assistance.



"Promoting Community Development Training" (CDT)

Paid training positions for TANF participants, includes training development courses and hands-on training opportunities.

SUBSIDIZED EMPLOYMENT

TANF funds may be spent on employment subsidies.

Employment subsidies are payments to employers or

3rd parties to help cover the costs of employee wages,
benefits (not insurance or retirement), workman's

compensation, taxes, supervision and training. Separate
budget established for reimbursing tribe for expenses.

WORK PARTICIPATION RATE

Specific activities creditable toward the Work
Participation Rate (WPR) include private sector and
public sector employment, education and training,
including career pathway programs and employer-based
programs which combine work with training.

Classroom and Basic Skills Training

- ▶ Provides classroom training in vocational and technical skills or equivalent knowledge.
- ► This training allows individuals to learn job skills, basic carpentry, form setting, concrete placement, plumbing, electrical, interior finish and building maintenance.
- ► The TANF participants get hands-on and classroom setting training to develop fundamental skills while earning wages.
- ► Hourly rate is generally \$10.50 to \$13.00 per hour depending on unsubsidized rate.
- ► Training funds earned while participating in CDT is excluded for TANF financial eligibility.

Worksite Training

On-site, hands-on training in employmentrelated skill building through the Community Development Training (CDT) Project.

Kelly Dickson



Kelly Dickson lives in Bylas, Arizona, a small town on the San Carlos Apache Tribe Reservation.

Kelly graduated from Arizona State University (ASU), class of 2017 with a Bachelor's Degree. After graduating it was difficult for her to find a job due to her not having work experience and limited opportunities for employment on the reservation. Kelly submitted applications for employment opportunities; however, none of the employers responded to her applications.

At first, Kelly was embarrassed to apply for the TANF Nnee Bich'o Nii Program and did not understand all that it entailed. Kelly applied as a Two-Parent Employment Program (TPEP) with her 2-year old daughter and her daughter's father in December 2018. Kelly started out participating as a volunteer while on the TANF Program to gain work experience. Kelly's Employment and Training (E&T) Counselor worked closely with Kelly and helped her start participating in the Community Development Training (CDT) Project as a receptionist with the Nnee Bich'o Nii TANF Program. Kelly completed her basic training for 3 months and then started volunteering hoping to utilize her new skills. While working as CDT with TANF, she was trained in the Tribal Automated System (TAS) that TANF uses. She learned computer skills by entering client support services, Monthly Eligibility Reports (MER), TANF payments, and Projects into TAS. Kelly also attended TANF policy training and in-service meetings with the TANF Program staff. These opportunities gave Kelly insight regarding what the TANF program was all about. Once a position for Employment and Training Counselor opened, Kelly applied for the job, went through the interview process and was selected for the job. Kelly's CDT activities gave her skills and confidence to become a full-time employee.

As of today Kelly is employed with the Nnee Bich'o Nii Services as an E&T Counselor. Kelly is very thankful for the CDT Project and Nnee Bich'o Nii Services for giving her the opportunity and training that she needed to become employed. The TANF Program helped her and her family financially and helped her family become self-sufficient.
