

# **FEDERAL** – TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES (TANF)

Eligible recipient households whose members are all U.S. citizens

# **STATE MOE** – TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR <u>OTHER</u> NEEDY FAMILIES (TAONF)


Eligible recipient households where there is at least one member that is a non-U.S. citizen or Compact of Free Association (COFA) migrant


- ❖ Hawaii State Constitution, Article IX, Section 3, established TAONF
- Continue to provide financial assistance to families that had been eligible under AFDC
- Eligibility and Work Participation Policies apply to both TANF and TAONF recipient households


#### TWO-GENERATIONAL APPROACH:

- Vocational Rehabilitation Training (University of Hawaii, Center on Disability Studies)
- Coaching for Success (PCG)

## Projects


- Integration of Public Health Nursing Services to address childhood development and health and well-being of families (Department of Health)
- Employment services for non-custodial parents (Child Support Enforcement Agency)
- Development of a new and comprehensive assessment tool (Hawaii Assessment Personal Appraisal or HAPA)



Hawaii is really energized about the integration of a two-generational approach and expansion of supportive services to TANF and TAONF recipient households.

## **EXPANSION OF SUPPORTIVE SERVICES:**

- Housing assistance payments
  - Act 237, SLH 2022 (HB2233)
  - Payments up to \$500 per month for TANF/TAONF recipients actively engaged in the work program
  - Projected start date early 2023
- Exit and Employment Retention Bonus Program
  - Act 128, SLH 2018 (HB2204)
  - Eligible for a bonus at TANF Exit, and retain full-time employment for 3, 6, 12, and 24 months following exit
  - o Previous bonus program ended in 2012 success rate at 83% of families who received at least one bonus payment did not receive TANF after exit (17% returned to receive TANF)
  - Projected start date early 2023
