Looking Back

Recovery Act Recap

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- Four Key Policy Drivers of the Recovery Act
 - Expedited and effective use of funds.
 - Transparency and accountability.
 - Emphasis on services for hard-to-serve populations.
 - Leverage long term system change.



Key Policy Drivers (Cont)



Emphasis on hard-to-serve populations:

- Priority for services to public assistance recipients and other low income individuals .
- Reemployment services funds targeted to UI claimants.
- Veterans priority of service requirements apply.
- Stimulus funding provides extra resources to serve hard to serve populations with support services such as needs-related payments, transportation, etc.
- Increased training facilitated by providing local boards additional flexibility to contract for training



Discretionary Funding



YouthBuild

- \$50 million in additional YouthBuild funding was awarded competitively.

- ◆ Over \$11 Million awarded to Region 5 States:

- ◆ IA(2), IL(3), IN(1), KS(1), MI(2), MN(2), MO(1), NE(2), OH(3), WI(2)

- Activities identical to current program.



Discretionary Funding (Cont)



Energy Training Partnership Grants - \$100 million

- **Purpose:** provide training and placement services for workers that prepare them to enter the energy efficiency and renewable energy industries, as well as green occupations within other industries.
- **\$25 million** of the total funds available through this solicitation will be awarded for projects serving **communities impacted by auto industry restructuring**.
 - ◆ ETA Region 5 states were awarded over \$39 million*
 - IL(2*), IN(1*), IA(1*), MI(2*), MO(2*), MN(2*), OH(5*), WI(1*)



Discretionary Funding (Cont)

● Green Capacity Building Grants - \$5 million

■ **Purpose:** help individuals acquire the skills needed to enter and advance in green industries and occupations by building the capacity of active DOL funded training programs to provide education and training in the key skills and competencies that are needed in these green industries and occupations.

- ◆ 12 Grants Awarded in ETA Region 5 totaling over \$1.1 Million (max. grant award \$100K).
 - IL(8), IN(1), NE(1), OH(1), WI(1)



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Discretionary Funding (Cont)

● Healthcare Sector Grants - \$250 Million

- **Purpose: To prepare participants for employment in industries that are being transformed by technology and innovation requiring new skill sets, or are projected to add substantial numbers of new jobs to the economy and to develop the pipeline of credentialed healthcare workers.**

- ◆ 18 Grants awarded in Region 5 totaling more than \$80 million.

- ◆ IL(2), IN(2), IA(1), MI(1), MN(4), MO(3), NE(1), OH(4)

Discretionary Funding (Cont)

Pathways Out of Poverty Grants - \$150 million

■ **Purpose:** integrate training and supportive services into cohesive programs that will help target populations find pathways out of poverty and into economic self-sufficiency through employment in the energy efficiency and renewable energy industries.

◆ 10 Grants Awarded to Region 5 States totaling more than \$45 Million.

● IL(1*), MI(3*), MN (1), MO(2), NE(1), OH (1) WI(1*)



Discretionary Funding (Cont)

State Energy Sector Partnerships and Training Grants – \$190M

- Grant funds awarded will be used to provide training, job placement, and related activities that reflect a comprehensive statewide energy sector strategy. **\$25 million** of the total funds available through this Solicitation will be awarded for projects serving **communities impacted by auto industry restructuring**.

- ◆ 10 Grants Awarded to ETA Region 5 states totaling more than \$58 million.

- ◆ IL(1), IN(1), IA(1), KS(1), MI(1), MN(1), MO(1), NE(1), OH(1), WI(1)



Apprenticeship and Job Corp

- Region 5 OA exploring Weatherization, Green Jobs, Transportation, Homeland Security and the Wind Energy and Renewable Energy Markets for apprenticeship opportunities
- A new Job Corps Center was recently completed in Milwaukee, Wisconsin that utilized a variety of green systems including geothermal heating and air conditioning
- ARRA funds were utilized to build a new state of the art Job Corps Center in Ottumwa, Iowa, which is nearing completion
