

METHODS OF COORDINATION

- Enhancing program communication and coordination
- Coordinating funding streams to provide more comprehensive services
- Supporting non-custodial parents and guardians in child-only TANF families

ENHANCING PROGRAM COMMUNICATION AND COORDINATION

Increased program coordination between TANF and SNAP E&T, through strategies such as integrated case management, use of one-stop career centers, use of community college coordinators, and staff training, can better support participants whose eligibility for TANF and SNAP changes as their circumstances change.

COORDINATING FUNDING STREAMS TO PROVIDE MORE COMPREHENSIVE SERVICES

 For states that provide non-recurrent shortterm benefits to low-income families through TANF funding, support services can be funded through SNAP E&T.



SUPPORTING NON-CUSTODIAL PARENTS AND GUARDIANS IN CHILD-ONLY TANF FAMILIES

 Several states have used SNAP E&T funding to provide education and training to noncustodial parents, with the hope that this increases the long-term economic stability of these individuals as well as their children, who may be in TANF families.
