#### Where Are they Now? Tales of Past TANF Clients

What really happens once TANF clients leave the program? TANF leaver studies, return on investment studies, outcome tracking, and unemployment insurance data all appear to be successful strategies and tools the programs highlighted in this session utilize to track where participants went. But who are the individuals and families behind some of these studies? In this storytelling session, participants will hear stories of real TANF leavers and what happened to them employment-wise and career-wise and to their families. What made them successful, did they encounter additional barriers, and did they come back to TANF and/or other social services? This session will provide key takeaways to participants on why they may want to use this data (or create it). Participants will also have the chance to engage in facilitated dialogue with their peers and a panel facilitator.
