Change in Mind Applying Neurosciences to Revitalize Communities



Change in Mind: Applying Neurosciences to Revitalize Communities is a three-year initiative of the Alliance for Strong Families and Communities. It is conducted in partnership with the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and the Palix Foundation's Alberta Family Wellness Initiative. The initiative was established in early 2015.

The primary purpose of Change in Mind is to demonstrate the larger impactful role of the nonprofit sector as educator, convener, advocate, and true influencer of getting appropriate systems aligned to the science.

The initiative will identify, support, and evaluate the processes that 15 organizations in the U.S. and Alberta, Canada will use to align the science with the goal of influencing systems to impact outcomes across the life course.

Ten U.S. members of the Alliance and five non-governmental organizations in Alberta, Canada were chosen to infuse, align, and accelerate established neuroscience discoveries about the effects of lifealtering toxic stress into their community-based work. It is the goal that their work will determine if this groundbreaking science can transform policies to move the needle on some of the most difficult social issues facing our communities.

The cohort sites were chosen by an independent selection committee through a competitive application process.
